



Officials Update



Data Specialists



- Data Specialists are responsible for all matters relating to the Data Results Centre
- Data Specialists (DS) are trained Skate Canada Officials
- DS maintain correct data flow throughout the competition
- DS ensure that all equipment and software used to tabulate results is functioning properly and up to date
- At competitions there is a Chief Data Specialist, a Computer Data Specialist and Data Specialists (worker bees)

Chief Data Specialist



- Is a member of the Skate Ontario Organizing Committee (OC) for their competition and participates in the site visit if applicable and participates in OC conference call meetings
- Is responsible for contacting all DS assigned to a competition and confirming their availability, their hotel requirements (if applicable) and any dietary allergies or restrictions
- Schedules DS at event based on competition schedule
- In conjunction with the Computer DS and Tech Rep determines equipment needs
- In conjunction with Computer DS ensures entry lists, draws and starting orders are complete

Computer Data Specialist



- Is a member of the Skate Ontario Organizing Committee (OC) for their competition and participates in the site visit if applicable and participates in OC conference call meetings
- Responsible for creating and maintaining the competition database
- Sends index file, entry lists, officials list, start orders and results to Skate Ontario Event Staff (SOSPOC) for online posting
- Responsible for onsite equipment set up and repacking post competition

Interested in becoming a DS?

- Any interested individual 16 years and over
- A skating background is not required
- Strong organizational skills an asset
- Computer skills, particularly with excel, an asset
- Becoming a Data Specialist is a great way to stay involved in skating and to give back to the sport

Upcoming Training Opportunities



- Skate Ontario is committed to offering training that prepares our Data Specialists to successfully complete the Skate Canada DS Exams
- Skate Ontario will offer Level I and Level II clinics this season. The location and dates will be determined by August
- Mentorship opportunities are available at most competitions this season
- DS attend clinics, complete workbooks and participate in practical assignments (at competitions) to secure promotions

Judges & Technical



- Judges 'Assess the quality of the elements and performance of a skater or team in a competition.' Skate Canada
- Technical Specialist 'Working as a team, they are responsible for the correct identification of elements and level of difficulty when attempted by skaters and teams in competition.' – Skate Canada

"Figure skating is a central part of my life," says William Lindsay. "I have met some amazing people through my involvement in this sport – skaters I trained with, coaches who taught me, and people with whom I judge. They have become some of my best friends. I have grown as a person through skating and have learned many things about myself. I know the value of hard work, dedication, and perseverance. I hope that skating will always be a part of my life."



At the suggestion of a judge from his club (at the time), William attended his first judges' clinic at 15 years old. It wasn't long before he received his first promotion at 16. "That was 18 years ago! This surpasses any paid occupation I have had."

• An Evaluator is an official who attends club test days and evaluates tests in all disciplines including, free skate, dance, skills and interpretive, and at all levels from senior bronze to gold and diamond dance.



How to become an Evaluator?

- 6 Steps to becoming an Evaluator in Ontario
 - 1. Attend class room style clinic
 - 2. Complete written exam
 - 3. Trial evaluate at test days
 - 4. Trial judging from at least 3 different test days
 - 5. Assessment at a supervised test day
 - 6. Promoted!
