

CanPowerSkate Course

COURSE FEE: \$340.00

Applications are accepted on a first come, first serve basis however registration will close once the maximum number of participants has been reached. Only completed applications will be processed. Spots cannot be reserved. Skate Ontario reserves the right to withdraw any applicant who does not meet the Skate Canada registration requirements.

This 2-day course will prepare coaches for the delivery of the *revised* CanPowerSkate program. Day 1 will explore basic technique of the Balance, Control and Agility skills taught in the CanPower program. Participants will also practice analyzing skills, error detection and discovering possible correction exercises. Day 2 will cover aspects of the revised CanPowerSkate Program. Topics will include session planning, components of a session (warm up, lesson time, development time and cool down), as well as how to assess in the program. Participants attending the course must wear hockey skates, hockey gloves and bring their own hockey or ringette stick during the on-ice training. Successful completion of the course will earn an NCCP In-training CanPowerSkate status. Additional evaluation components are required after the course to earn a Trained status. Please see below for a more detailed look at the revised CanPowerSkate pathway.

TO BE ELIGIBLE TO REGISTER FOR THE CANPOWERSKATE COURSE, PARTICIPANTS MUST UPLOAD PROOF OF THE FOLLOWING:

1. Proof of age – must be 16 years of age by the start of the course, no exceptions.
2. Proof of a Skate Canada, Hockey Canada or Ringette Canada NCCP status.
3. Completion of the [NCCP Coach Initiation In Sport online training module](#).
4. Proof of your 2018/2019 Skate Canada Registration or Skate Canada Professional Coaching membership, in good-standing.

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING:

The membership season is in effect from September 1 - August 31 each year. To become a Skate Canada Registrant, please contact your local Skate Canada club.

REGISTRATION DETAILS:

- * Incomplete applications will be subject to a \$75.00 administrative fee. This includes missing/incorrect documentation.

- Be at least 16 years of age
- Skate Canada, Hockey Canada or Ringette Canada NCCP status

- Registered for the current season
- NCCP status (renewed when certified)
- Valid First Aid
- Clear Screening
- Accepted Skate Canada's Code of Ethics
- Complete the Respect in Sport Activity Leader Training

NCCP DEADLINE

Coaches have 3 years from earning an In-Training status to become Certified

- CanPowerSkate Pre-Course (in development)

- Successfully complete an on-ice assessment
- Successfully complete the course and classroom workbook

- Wear hockey skates and bring a stick
- Demonstrate all CPS skills with a hockey/ringette stick
- Know how to apply skills to game situations.
- Helmets are highly recommended
