

Juvenile to Senior Invitational Singles Judge Seminar

What is a Juvenile to Senior Invitational Singles Judge Seminar?

The goal of the Juvenile to Senior Invitational Singles Judge seminar is to prepare prospective judges to serve as contributing members of event judging panels with confidence and success.

To achieve this goal and through participation in the seminar, prospective judges will:

- Receive an overview of the event structure
- Gain the necessary technical knowledge that will enable them to accurately apply the standards of assessment for all technical elements and program components
- Participate in mock panels to simulate an event experience
- Learn the duties and competencies required of judges
- Become familiar with event procedures
- Receive direction on next steps for appointment as a judge following the clinic

Who can become a Judge?

- Must be at least 16 years old (may be under 16 at time of training)
- Have a valid Skate Canada number and be eligible to officiate as a judge
- Have current STAR 1-4 Judge Qualification or Juvenile Judge Qualification
- Must meet one of the following “Skating Background” criteria as defined by Skate Canada:
 - Any two of Junior Bronze or STAR 5 Free Skating, Skills, Dance tests, or
 - Any one of Senior Bronze Free Skating, Skills, Dance, or a Juvenile Competitive Test, or
 - Any one higher level test

Seminar Information:

Information needed before registering:

- Please make sure you have your Skate Canada number ready for registration.

You must attend the entire clinic. The schedule for this clinic is as follows:

- Friday 6 pm – 9:30 pm
- Saturday 9 am – 5 pm
- Sunday 9 am – 4 pm
- Meals will be provided for Friday Dinner, Saturday & Sunday Lunch. When possible, a vegetarian option may be available. If you have any other dietary concerns, please bring your own food if that doesn't work for you. All other meals will be at the candidate's expense.
- Please note that all other expenses including mileage will be the candidate's responsibility. However, for those candidates who live more than 1.5 hours drive one way, a hotel room, double occupancy, will be provided. Once you have signed into the Skate Canada eLearning site, follow these steps to access your homework:

(A) Singles Judge Online Module:

1. On the opening page, scroll down to “**Standards for Evaluating Figure Skating**”.
2. Choose “**Senior Section Level Singles Judge Pre-Course Training**”.
3. Choose “Self Enroll”, then follow the module. It is a long training module, but it can be done in parts.
4. At the end of the module, there is an “exam” that is required to be completed.
5. There is an option at the end of the exam to view all answers. Please save/print and bring along with you to the Seminar.
6. Finally, once the exam is completed, print the completion certificate. Prior to the clinic date you will receive an email from the Learning Facilitator indicating when it needs to be completed and who to send it to.

(B) Skate Canada +5/-5 GOE Online Module:

1. On the opening page, scroll down to “**Standards for Evaluating Figure Skating**”.
2. Choose “**Marking Guidelines +5 -5 GOE Scale: Singles**”.
3. Choose “Self Enroll”, then follow the module. It should take you approximately 30 minutes to complete.
4. Finally, once completed, print the completion certificate. Prior to the clinic date you will receive an email from the Learning Facilitator indicating when it needs to be completed and who to send it to.

*Please note there will be a maximum number of 15 participants.
