1. Skate Canada is launching new mandatory training modules for officials. All officials <u>must</u> complete the Skate Canada Code of Ethics for Officials and Respect in Sport training <u>prior</u> to **September 1, 2019** in order to be eligible to officiate in the 2019-2020 season.

The Introduction, Skills and Artistic modules and exams are now available. These will be required before you can assess in STAR 6-Gold. The Freeskate and Dance modules will be coming later this fall.

As we transition into STAR 6-Gold, Assessments for Skills and Artistic will be offered in STAR 6-Gold as of September 1, 2019. Assessments for Freeskate and Dance will be offered in Sr. Bronze- Gold until the respective training modules are ready this fall. You may be asked to assess both new and old assessments until we have fully transitioned.
