An invitation is extended to all eligible figure skaters to participate in the 2020 Skate Ontario Adult Championships. Skate Canada rules and regulations will apply throughout the competition unless otherwise specified.

There are no geographic restrictions for this event-it is open to all eligible adults

REGISTRATION:

Registration for this event is an online submission and must be completed in full, including payment. Registrants must also acknowledge and agree to all policies listed in the cart for the entry to be finalized.

Registration opens at 4:00 pm, DST on Wednesday, January 22, 2020.

CLOSING DATE:

Access to online registration will cease at **11:59 pm** DST February 2, 2020. Registrations will be accepted on a first come - first serve basis. Please review your entry information before submitting.

CONFIRMATION EMAILS:

An email copy of each registration invoice will be automatically generated and sent to the account holder at the email address on the registrant's profile.

COACHES' CONFIRMATION EMAILS:

Coaches will receive an email confirming their athlete's registration information if the correct email is provided at registration. It is the responsibility of the registrant to ensure the accuracy of the coach(es) email.

ADULT TEAM ELEMENTS:

This Category is comparable to US Figure Skating Team Maneuvers
Event procedures for all levels:

- All categories are assessed to standard with ranking
- Each team will consist of three to five members
- Males and females will compete on the same team
- One element will be performed by each member of the team
- Each skater may perform no more than two elements
- Skaters do not have to represent the same Club
- A skater may only compete on one team
- Skaters may skate up one level from their Free Skate level

Bronze Team

For skaters approximately at the Bronze Free Skating Category level

- Element #1 Waltz Jump + toeloop Jump Combination
- Element #2 any single + single Jump Combination
- Element #3 forward and backward Spirals
- Element #4 one-foot Spin, either forward or backward entry
- Element #5 Sit Spin, minimum three revolutions

Silver Team

For skaters approximately at the Silver Free Skating Category level



- Element #1 single axel
- Element #2 any single + single Jump Combination
- Element #3 layback or cross foot Spin
- Element #4 camel/sit Combination Spin
- Element #5 Spiral or step sequence

Gold Team

For skaters approximately at the Gold and/or Masters Free Skating Category level

- Element #1 single axel
- Element #2 any Jump Combination or sequence
- Element #3 layback or cross foot Spin
- Element #4 any Combination Spin; flying entry optional
- Element #5 Spiral or step sequence

ADULT SHOWCASE:

Showcase programs are designed by the skaters and/or coach and focus on the skater's ability to entertain an audience through the use of theatrics or artistic abilities. Programs may tell a story, create a mood or have an obvious theme. This Category is comparable to US Figure Skating Dramatic and Light Skate Entertainment.

Program content requirements and event procedures for all levels:

- Theatrical costumes and hand props are permitted
- Feathers and boas of any type are not permitted
- Vocal music is permitted
- All single jumps are permitted; jumps of any higher rotation will be subject to an illegal element violation
- A maximum of one minute will be permitted prior to each performance for the skater(s) to warm-up and set up any props as necessary

Adult Introductory Showcase

For skaters approximately at the Intro Open Free Skating Category level

Program time is a maximum of one minute 40 seconds

Adult Bronze Showcase

For skaters approximately at the Bronze Free Skating Category level

Program time is a maximum of one minute 40 seconds

Adult Silver Showcase

For skaters approximately at the Silver Free Skating Category level

Program time is a maximum of one minute 40 seconds

Adult Gold Showcase



For skaters approximately at the Gold and/or Masters Free Skating Category level

Program time is a maximum of one minute 40 seconds

Adult Elite Showcase

For skaters approximately at the level of former competitive skaters

Program time is a maximum of one minute 40 seconds

Adult Open Couples Showcase

For skaters approximately at the Bronze to Silver Free Skating Category level (both skaters)

Program time is a maximum of one minute 40 seconds

Adult Open Masters Couples Showcase

For skaters approximately at the Gold to Elite Masters Free Skating Category level (both skaters)

Program time is a maximum of one minute 40 seconds

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Registration is finalized only when all information and payment is complete. Your receipt of payment is your registration confirmation. Please print your receipt and retain for your records.

LATE ENTRIES: Entries received after the closing date will be considered by the Technical Representative for registration. Late entries are subject to a \$100.00 late fee. No late entries will be considered after start orders are posted (2 weeks before event start).

REFUNDS: Full refunds will be given for any cancelled categories.

MEDICAL REFUNDS: Medical refunds will be granted at 50% of registration fees until the commencement of the competition on April 3, 2020. All medical requests must be sent to Michelle Hunsley mhunsley@skateontario.org. This request **MUST** be received before the first skate of the day on April 3, 2020 and **MUST** be accompanied by a signed medical physician's (MD) note. Notes from non-medical care providers such as physiotherapists, chiropractors or athletic therapists are NOT acceptable.

RESTRICTIONS: In the case of a very large entry in any category, the entries will be drawn into groups. All drawn groups are final and cannot be changed. Singles skaters are permitted to enter only one singles free skate category.

ON-SITE REGISTRATION: All competitors and Skate Canada registered coaches are required to register upon arrival at the arena. Registration and music registration will commence one hour prior to the first category of the day. Each competitor will receive an accreditation tag that must be retained and used as a pass for the duration of the competition. All skaters **MUST** have their music and planned program content sheet when registering. Coaches must provide proof that they are a registered Skate Canada Professional Coach in Good Standing.



MUSIC: Each entry must provide two CDs of the correct music for the competition upon registration, one for competition - marked "Master" and one for back up - marked "Copy". These must be registered with music registration at least one hour prior to the posted start time of the category and may not be removed for any reason until after the category is completed. CD Audio Discs are the only music format accepted. iPhones, iPods or other digital sources will not be accepted as backups. Music must be picked up within 30 minutes after completion of the category.

PATTERN DANCE MUSIC: Competitors must also submit 2 copies of their pattern dance music even if they are skating to Skate Canada Series Eight music or ISU Ice Dance music.

All music used must be in the public domain or covered by the performing rights societies. Competitors who have music composed specifically for their programs either wholly or in part, are responsible for obtaining a written release from the composer for the use of such music on radio and/or television or appropriate clearance from the performing rights societies.

Standard Specifications for Music:

- (1) Only one program shall be recorded on each CD
- (2) Competitor's name followed by home club, category, program type-short or free and music time shall be printed on front of the CD label using a black Sharpie pen
- (3) Each CD shall be enclosed in a plastic case in good repair marked with the skater's name, home club, category, program type – short or free, and total music time

Technical Guidelines for Music CDs:

- (1) Music on CD must be burned in CD Audio Format (NOT mp3;.acc or DVD)
- (2) Music should be burned on CD-R discs of good quality that provide legible space for the skater information to be printed on
- (3) It is recommended that CDs be burned at speeds 16Xs or less
- (4) Skater or Team should keep a set of CDs for COMPETITION USE ONLY. It is recommended that this set be used for each competition unless the music has been changed

AWARDS: Medals for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place will be awarded for each category. Medal presentation information will be available at the competition.

COACH ACCREDITATION: To be accredited at the 2020 Skate Ontario Adult Championships, coaches must be Primary STARSkate trained or certified. Ontario coaches must present their Skate Ontario issued Coach's Accreditation Tag. **No other form of identification will be accepted.** Out of province coaches must provide proof that they are a Registered Skate Canada Professional Coach in Good Standing when registering at the Coaches' sign in table. Up to two certified coaches per entry will be accredited.
