3. STAR 6-Gold Updates

Gold Evaluators - Promotion <u>applications</u> are now open. Please apply after completing the e-module and exam per discipline. You will need to upload your certificates of achievement. Promotion application will be processed on an ongoing basis. You will see promotions reflected on your Skate Canada profile shortly after your application has been verified and processed.

4. Assessment Days (Test Days)

Skills, Artistic, Freeskate and Dance have now transitioned into our STAR 6-Gold program. All assessments will need to be in the STAR 6- Gold program as of November 1, 2019. The modules are available on the Skate Canada eLearning site.

If you have committed to an Assessment Day in November, don't forget to complete any STAR 6-Gold modules that you may still need to complete.

6. Performance & Development Opportunities

How does that affect you as an official? Any in-club events, such as monitoring/feedback sessions, performance opportunities, simulations that request the use of officials now require a sanction.

7. Mindfulness

All officials have a role and process to complete their required tasks whether it be at a competition, assessment day or performance and development opportunities. Let us be respectful and mindful of each other and their role, whether it be as a judge, event technician, data specialist or technical official.

8. Skate Canada Code of Ethics for Officials and Respect in Sport

10. Rowans Law

As many of you may be aware, aspects of Rowan's Law (Concussion Safety), 2018 and Ontario Regulation 161/19 (the regulations that support Rowan's Law) came into effect on July 1, 2019. Additional aspects will come into effect on July 1, 2020.

With the support of Skate Canada, a short learning module that <u>must</u> be reviewed by all officials and completed <u>prior</u> to officiating. This module outlines the obligations of coaches and officials to ensure compliance with Rowan's Law.
