Skate Ontario Return to Play Protocols – Day Camps (these "Protocols")

Effective June 11, 2021

These Protocols are Skate Ontario's rules and policies and are intended to enable a safe return to the sport when clubs and skating schools are running day camps. These Protocols are based on current Ontario statutes and regulations, current public health requirements and directives, and Skate Ontario's desire to make our sport safe for all. These Protocols may be updated at any time; please be sure that you are referring to the most recent Version which will be posted from time to time on Skate Ontario's website at www.skateontario.org. These Protocols are subject to all federal, provincial and municipal laws, regulations, by-laws and orders as they may exist from time to time.

Clubs and skating schools that offer day camps for children must operate these in a manner consistent with the COVID-19 Safety Guidelines for Day Camps produced by the Office of the Chief Medical Officer of Health found here: https://www.health.gov.on.ca/en/pro/programs/publichealth/coronavirus/docs/2019_summer_day_camps_guidance.pdf

Day Camp Operations DCO – 001	Compliance with regulations	 All day camps must adhere to all federal, provincial and municipal laws, regulations, by-laws and orders as they may exist from time to time. This includes but is not limited to compliance with: Physical distancing measures Health and safety regulations Size of permitted gatherings Skate Canada rules, policies and procedures Skate Ontario rules, policies and procedures All Safe Sport policies and procedures Applicable occupational health and safety requirements
Day Camp Operations DCO – 002	Compliance with these Protocols	Each club, skating school and coach conducting day camps (whether or not on rented non-club ice) must implement and comply with the current Version of these Protocols. Each club, skating school and coach is also responsible for implementing and complying with any updated Version of these Protocols as posted from time to time. The Acknowledgement, Release, Indemnity, and Assumption of Risk regarding COVID-19 form provided as part of these Protocols must be completed by each participant in club or skating school day camps (including staff, skaters, coaches, choreographers and volunteers). This form must be completed prior to the start of participation in day camps. This form is only required to be completed one time by each participant. The club or skating school must keep this form on-file for each participant. It is not necessary to submit this to Skate Ontario, but it may be requested by Skate Ontario at any time. Any non-implementation or non-compliance may have consequences and could jeopardize insurance coverage.

Day Camp Operations DCO – 003	COVID-19 Education	 Each club and skating school must ensure that staff, coaches, skaters, parents, members and volunteers receive education on new safety and hygiene protocols within the club / skating school as well as Government-approved information on ways to limit the spread of COVID-19 including: Respiratory etiquette Hand hygiene Physical distancing Use of Personal Protective Equipment (e.g. face masks) Note: Please see Appendix A for samples of these education tools
Day Camp Operations DCO - 004	COVID-19 Management Plan	Clubs and skating schools must follow the Ontario COVID-19 Safety Guidelines for Day Camps with respect to reporting and management of all probable or confirmed cases of COVID-19 related to day camp participants or staff.
Day Camp Operations DCO – 005	Club / Skating School Offices	All club administrative activities should be conducted on-line and virtually whenever possible.
Day Camp Operations DCO - 006	Facility Coordination	Each club and skating school must coordinate with the relevant facility in order to ensure compliance with these Protocols as well as the Ontario COVID-19 Safety Guidelines for Day Camps.
Day Camp Operations DCO - 007	Screening measures	All individuals taking part in club / skating school day camps must self- screen in accordance with current public heath guidelines and the Ontario COVID-19 Safety Guidelines for Day Camps.
Day Camp Operations DCO - 008	Tracking of participants in day camps	Clubs and skating schools are required tracking participants in day camps according to the Ontario COVID-19 Safety Guidelines for Day Camps.
Day Camp Operations DCO - 009	Vaccination	Clubs and skating schools that operate day camps should strongly encourage all eligible staff and campers to receive COVID-19 vaccination as soon as possible, and at the earliest opportunity before the camp starts.

Day Camp Operations DCO - 011	Programming	The following programs may operate as part of day camps provided they follow the COVID-19 Safety Guidelines for Day Camps as well as Skate Ontario Limitations on cohort sizes (see DCO-010) and all provincial, local and facility requirements:

Day Camp Operations DCO - 013	Pairs and Ice Dance	 Pairs / Ice Dance couples should follow the guidelines below if they are taking part in day camps: Skaters are permitted to contact each other within the facility, provided they are part of the same household or social circle Skaters are encouraged to continue hand hygiene practices by sanitizing their hands before and after all sessions where contact has taken place

Day Camp Operations DCO - 014	On-Ice Coaching	Coaches must follow the COVID-19 Safety Guidelines for Day Camps with respect to maintaining consistent staffing for cohorts for the duration of the program.	
Day Camp Operations DCO - 015	Harness	 The use of harnesses is permitted in the following situations: Mounted and portable harnesses are permitted The skater and coach must wear a non-medical face mask at all times when the harness is in use The harness must be disinfected and/or sanitized before and after each use using a spray or wipe The coach/skater should sanitize their hands before and after use Where possible, coaches are encouraged to stay more than 2m apart from skaters during harness lessons Harness lessons should be limited to no more than 15 minutes with adequate time allowed in between lessons to disinfect the equipment Consideration could be made to making a secondary disinfected harness or chest strap available in order to more easily rotate skaters between harness lessons
