

Regional Coach Course

COURSE FEE: \$450.00

Applications are accepted on a first come, first serve basis however registration will close once the maximum number of participants has been reached. Only completed applications will be processed. Spots cannot be reserved. Skate Ontario reserves the right to withdraw any applicant who does not meet the Skate Canada registration requirements.

DESCRIPTION:

The Regional Coach Program prepares coaches to develop skaters at the Learn to Train and Learn to Compete stages of the Long-Term Athlete Development model (LTAD) in figure skating. Specifically, this context focuses on the STAR 1-5 program. Regional Coaches are qualified to coach all Skate Canada figure skating programs and levels. By taking this course, participants will earn a Regional Coach “In-Training” status.

TO REGISTER, PARTICIPANTS MUST:

1. Hold a CanSkate “Certified” NCCP status (no exceptions).
2. Have passed one complete Senior Bronze STARSkate test OR the Junior Bronze/STAR 5 Freeskate assessment plus one additional Junior Bronze/STAR 5 assessment.
3. Skaters must hold either a 2021-2022 or 2022-2021 Skate Canada membership depending on when your course is being held.

Please note the following:

Our membership season is in effect from September 1st - August 31st each year. Memberships must be renewed annually. Registrant memberships can be obtained through your local Skate Canada club. Professional coaching memberships may be obtained through the Skate Canada Membership portal. Either membership will suffice.

REGISTRATION DETAILS:

- *No refunds will be issued after the registration deadline date.
- *Cancellations before the deadline date will be subject to a \$75.00 administrative fee.
- *Incomplete applications will be subject to a \$75.00 administrative fee. This includes missing/incorrect documentation.
- *Requests to change courses cannot be accommodated.
- *Course cancellations are at the sole discretion of Skate Ontario.

NCCP PLAGIARISM POLICY:

Skate Ontario takes plagiarism very seriously. Consequently, submissions as part of the NCCP course curriculum must be one’s own work. Submitting someone else’s work, in whole or in part, will result in a “needs improvement” evaluation, requiring a resubmission. Skate Ontario reserves the right to suspend one’s privileges.
