In addition to competing at International and Junior and Senior Grand Prix events in singles, pairs, dance and synchro, Skate Ontario athletes proudly represented Canada around the world at all major International Skating Union events. We are #SkateOntarioProud.

On the horizon are more occasions to listen to membership, consider everyone's feedback and continue our efforts to tweak and improve our plans to deliver the best figure skating programs in the country. CANSKATE EXCELLENCE

Skate Ontario launched the CanSkate Excellence recognition program to recognize clubs for demonstrating excellence in the delivery of their CanSkate program. Over the course of the year, 15 Skate Ontario Clubs were recognized with Advanced Standard and eight with Achieved Standard.


SUMMER TRAVEL TEAM

Two workshops were held for the adult skating community. Both workshops were led by Tyler Morris who kept everyone moving with edges, turns, stroking exercises and spins. 16 participants attended the November workshop in Komoka and 37 attended the February workshop in Toronto.

Skate Ontario has over 2,000 registered coaches who are responsible for developing Ontario skaters from the grassroots of CanSkate right to the pinnacle of our sport at the World and Olympic championships. We are fortunate in Ontario to have some of the best coaches in the world who dedicate themselves to developing Ontario skaters at all levels.








 More than 80 on-site visits at training locations and competitions with Skate Ontario high performance staff, officials and OHSPI athletes

NEXTGEN

These skaters participated in a Team Camp in May 2018 that provided an opportunity for training and workshops that focused on sport psychology. 
2019 PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Skate Ontario hosted its first Provincial Championships in March 2019 in Mississauga, ON. The event was a great success and provincial figure skating champions were crowned for the first time by Skate Ontario in women, men, pair, ice dance, triathlon and synchro.

2019 SKATE CANADA SYNCHRONIZED SKATING CHAMPIONSHIPS



Skate Ontario was pleased to host the 2019 Skate Canada Synchronized Skating Championships in Waterloo, ON. Nearly 4,000 skating fans attended this competition for the chance to see the best synchronized skating teams in Canada. More than 40 teams and over 800 skaters competed for the chance to be crowned Canadian champions. 20 teams from across Ontario participated in this event and won a total of six medals – with at least one medal won at each level.

2018 SKATE CANADA AUTUMN CLASSIC INTERNATIONAL

Skate Ontario was pleased to host the 2018 Skate Canada Autumn Classic International (ACI). This ISU Challenger Series event was held in Oakville in September, 2018. ACI was the fifth event on the ISU Challenger Series of events in the 2018/19 season. More than 4,000 people filled the stands to watch skaters from around the world compete for titles. Ontario was thrilled to have five entries in the event: two men, one pair team and two dance teams.

2018 STRENGTH IN UNITY

In June of 2018, Skate Ontario hosted the inaugural Strength in Unity community event – the first of its kind following the amalgamation of the four Ontario Sections. There were over 300 attendees at this conference including club board members, coaches, officials and volunteers.
