CanSkate Coach Pathway

All aspiring Skate Canada coaches begin NCCP training at the Learn to Skate level teaching Skate Canada's flagship program, CanSkate. The coach pathway is represented below. CanSkate Coaches are eligible to coach the CanSkate Program.

Certification Deadline

Coaches have three years from the date of the in-training course to certify as a CanSkate coach.

Pre-Requisites

- Be a current Skate Canada registrant with a Skate Canada Club.
- Be minimum 15 years of age.
- Has passed at least one complete Star 5 Assessment.
 If you do not meet this pre-requisite, please contact your Section Course Administrator.
- Has completed the following Skate Canada eLearning training:
 - Part A Coaching Foundations eLearning course
 - Part B CanSkate Foundations eLearning course

In-Training Status

- Attend an in-person 2-day course.
- Meet the standard as set in the NCCP CanSkate Coach Participant Guidelines.
- Coaches with an In-Training Status have three years to complete their certification.

PowerSkate Coach Pathway

The PowerSkate Coach Program prepares coaches to develop hockey and ringette players at the Learn to Train stage of LTD. The program serves as a transition out of CanSkate, to further develop sport-specific skating skills. Coaches going through the PowerSkate pathway will explore the delivery of the program and can utilize what they have learned to customize an advanced delivery of power skating. PowerSkate Coaches are qualified to coach the PowerSkate program.

Certification Deadline

Coaches have three years from the date of the in-training course to become Certified PowerSkate Coach.

- Be a current Skate Canada registrant with a Skate Canada Club or a registered Coach in good standing.
- Be minimum 15 years of age.
- Has a Skate Canada CanSkate Coach, Hockey Canada, or Ringette Canada NCCP Status.

- Has passed one complete Star 6 assessment or Star 5 Freeskate assessment plus one additional Star 5
 assessment.
- Has completed the following Skate Canada eLearning training:
 - Part A Coaching Foundations eLearning course
 - Part B CanSkate Foundations eLearning course
 - o Part C Regional Foundations eLearning course
- Has completed the 2-day CanSkate Course

In-Training Status

Prior to enrolling in the portfolio, coaches are required to have athletes at the Pre-Novice/Novice level for Singles, Pairs and Dance. For Synchronized skating, teams must be at Novice, Intermediate or Open. To assist with coach development, the portfolio consists of the following components:

- A skater's or team's yearly plan
- Two lessons (Foundational skating lesson and a technical lesson)
 - The technical lesson must include one of the elements identified in the discipline of choice:
 - Singles: Double Axel or triple jump of choice
 - Pairs: Group 3, 4 or 5 lift or twist
 - Dance: Dance spin or lift
 - Synchro: Pivoting block or intersection
- Training session observation
- Submission of the pre-course workbooks
- Make Ethical Decisions online evaluation

Becoming a Certified Provincial Coach

- When ready to complete the certification process, Coaches must enroll in Provincial Coach Certified Evaluation Portfolio through the eLearning site.
 - You will be prompted to pay a \$255 evaluation fee prior to entry. Please note, this fee is non-refundable. Coaches should enroll in this course only when they are prepared to finish the portfolio in a timely manner.

Upon enrollment, the following events will take place:

- The coach will be assigned a coach evaluator by Skate Canada
- The coach evaluator will set up a time with the coach to review the portfolio (pre-brief conversation)

National Coach Pathway

The National Coach Program is designed for coaches working with Train to Compete athletes who will acquire the necessary skill set to improve athlete performance in preparation for provincial, national, and in some cases international competitions.

Pre-Requisites

- Must be a certified Provincial Coach status
- Must be either a registered Skate Canada coach in good standing

In-Training Status

- Attend Analyze Technical and Tactical Performance (ATTP) course either virtually or in-person
- Complete ATTP workbook successfully

In a multi-skating discipline environment, the ATTP 2-day course prepares coaches to refine advanced figure skating skills and strategize plans for helping their athletes reach their full potential. At the ATTP course, coaches will analyze technical skills at the junior or senior competitive levels. Based on the following learning objectives, the ATTP course will prepare coaches to:

- Analyze technical and tactical performance by observing and defining key factors that influence competitive performance
- Analyze technical and tactical performance by applying the principles of motion to detect and correct key performance factors
- Identify strategies to monitor and evaluate the technical and tactical performance
- Implement and assess the effectiveness of corrections

The National Coach Certified Evaluation Portfolio provides a platform for coaches to show their ability to coach Train to Compete figure skaters. Coaches are required to work with Junior to Senior podium pathway athletes in at least one skating discipline – singles, ice dance, pair skating, or synchronized skating. National Coach evaluation is broken down into three parts; Part 1 – Coach Portfolio, Part 2 – Observation of a training session at your club or skating school and Part 3 – Observation of a competition with a Junior or Senior level podium pathway athlete.

Part 1: Coaching Portfolio

Upon enrollment, the following events will take place:

- The coach will be assigned a coach evaluator by Skate Canada
- The coach evaluator will set up a time with the coach to review the portfolio (pre-brief conversation), set up at time for the Observation training session and/or Observation of a competition.
- The coach will complete the portfolio requirements and notify the evaluator
 - o Ensure portfolio is in fillable Portfolio Template
 - Submit for marking
- The coach evaluator will review the portfolio
 - Please allow four weeks for marking
- The coach evaluator will schedule a time with the coach to review the portfolio as well as create an action
 plan (debrief). The action plan may include additional professional development activities such as eLearning,
 resubmission of lessons, mentor coach lessons, etc.

Part 2: Observation of a training session at your club or skating school

Upon enrollment, the following events will take place:

• The coach will be assigned a coach evaluator by Skate Canada

- The coach evaluator will set up a time with the coach to review the Observation training session (pre-brief conversation)
- 1-hour observation to be scheduled
- Debrief post observation

The purpose of this observation is to evaluate the skills to manage an athlete in a training environment.

Part 3: Observation of a competition with a Junior or Senior level competitive athlete.

Upon enrollment, the following events will take place:

- The coach will be assigned a coach evaluator by Skate Canada
- The coach evaluator will set up a time with the coach to review the Observation of a competition (pre-brief conversation)
- Observation of a competitive event at the Junior or Senior level
- Debrief post event

Becoming a Certified National Coach

- When ready to complete the certification process, Coaches must enroll in National Coach Certified Evaluation Portfolio through the eLearning site.
 - National Coach portfolio evaluation: \$100
 - National Coach training session observation: \$200
 - National Coach competition observation: \$200
 - Re-evaluation/observation fees may be applicable based on the areas identified as future strengths
