

Skate Ontario STAR 1 Event Delivery Model – 2024-2025

Guiding Principles for Event Management (For Technical Representatives)

- **Create a positive, organized, and relaxed environment:** Ensure a fun, participatory experience for each skater by limiting chaos and maintaining good organization and flow.
- Foster a well-organized environment: Good planning contributes significantly to the overall experience.
- **Provide a great first performance experience:** Aim to make the event memorable and enjoyable for skaters.
- **Continuous Movement:** Plan for skaters to move throughout the event to reinforce LTD stage appropriate principles.

STAR 1 Event Management Procedure Recommendations

The STAR 1 Event Management procedures align with the above guiding principles.

- **Group Organization:** When forming groups, keep skaters from the same club together, group by age and when applicable, a group for boys. This supports coaches and enhances event flow.
- Warm-up Planning: Conduct warmups on both ends of the ice surface.
- **Event Execution:** Events will take place in the center of the ice, with a maximum of two skaters performing simultaneously. This arrangement is ideal for spectating, taking photos, and optimizing warm-up space. Skaters will perform the following elements in sets:
 - Stroking Exercise Tech rep will draw to determine which direction (clockwise or counterclockwise)
 - Jump Elements 3 jumps
 - Spin Elements 2 spins
 - Spiral Sequence

After each set, the skater will return to their coach at the boards and wait for their turn the perform the next set

- **Event Scheduling:** Each group will complete their performance in its entirety before the next group(s) of skaters will enter the ice to avoid confusion, particularly for young skaters.
- **Evaluation:** Ensure that all level requirements are clearly communicated (will be included in the event announcement).
- Additional Support: During planning, consult with the LOC for additional assistance, access the Skate Canada Event Management Star 1-4 document, assign two PAs to help coaches with STAR 1 skaters and ensure Ice Captains are aware of process for groups entering and leaving the ice.
