

This year's Annual Report is a celebration of the entire Ontario skating community as we reflect on the past year filled with overwhelming dedication and perseverance, valuable collaboration and extraordinary success stories.

The completion of the 2023-2024 skating season marks the end of year one of our 2023-2027 Strategic Plan, with a mission to deliver the best programs and events to support skating for fun, fitness and achievement. We are proud to report that we are well on our way to meeting and exceeding our targets as we work towards our 2027 goals to better serve our stakeholders.

We proudly supported over 329 member clubs and skating schools last season through education, resources and support. Various toolkits and policy templates were also developed and distributed for clubs to use in a practical way to foster organizational excellence.

From a programming perspective, the Skate Ontario CanSkate Excellence Recognition Program has continued to grow in clubs and skating school across the province and over 50 in-person club visits were completed to better connect with our community.

A true highlight of this season, the Club Modernization Pilot Program, was developed and implemented, with the Sioux Lookout SC being the first club to take part in the program. It was met with overwhelming success, and we are excited to be expanding the pilot program next season.

On the high performance scene, we would like to congratulate Piper Gilles and Paul Poirier for earning a world silver medal in Montreal in March. We would also like to highlight and recognize all of the Skate Ontario athletes who proudly represented Canada on the international stage and the skaters who represented Ontario domestically across the country.

This year we were thrilled to host 36 events across Ontario along with nine of our ever popular Bring ON the Fun! events. The event season concluded with the coveted Provincial Championships in March, featuring over 900 athletes. All of this would not be possible without the selfless dedication of our amazing LOCs, volunteers and officials that we appreciate so much!

As we look ahead to next year, we are excited to continue to strive towards Club and Skating School Excellence, Skating Excellence and Organizational Excellence to create athlete-centred, healthy environments in arenas across the province.





Club and Skating School Services

Skate Ontario's incredible Member Clubs and Skating Schools deliver cutting-edge programming and opportunities for skaters of all levels and ages, in all disciplines, and are the foundation of Ontario's skating community. Skate Ontario proudly supported over 329 Member Clubs and Skating Schools during the 2023/24 season.

Almost two years ago, in the fall of 2022, Skate Ontario launched the Organizational Excellence Program as a way of offering enhanced service and support to our Member Clubs and Skating Schools. This program provides education, resources, support and accountability to our Member Clubs and Skating Schools facilitating the implementation of good governance, sound fiscal practices, risk management and communication.

Toolkit Development and Implementation

Skate Ontario developed and launched various toolkits, guides and templates to help our member clubs and skating school navigate different scenarios and effectively manage good governance, including:

- Self-Assessment Tool
- Suite of Policy Templates

Developed and launched the Member Satisfaction Survey. We are pleased to report that the results of this survey report a Member Satisfaction Rating of 7.72%!

Club and Skating School Accountability

Developed and launched club and skating school membership Memorandums of Understanding, 77% of which have been returned to Skate Ontario.

76% of member clubs & skating schools have created accounts in the Skate Ontario Members Portal, a tool to promote engagement and information sharing amongst clubs and skating schools.

12 individualized Club Board Training Sessions delivered (combined in person and virtual).

Club and Skating School Recognition

Created the Skate Ontario Club/Skating School of the Year Award, and presented this award to our inaugural winner, the Mississauga Skating Club!

Created the Skate Ontario Club/Skating School Local Volunteer of the Year Award, and presented this award to Carolyn Moss.

Skate Canada Club of the Year awarded to the Char-Lan Skating Club – the first Ontario club to receive this national award!

Skate Ontario Club and Skating School Services provided onsite engagement at 5 events during this skating season.

































CanSkate Excellence

CanSkate is Canada's flagship learn to skate program, emphasizing quality fundamental movements and basic skating skills. The Skate Ontario CanSkate Excellence Recognition Program rewards Ontario clubs and skating schools implementing best practices in the delivery of their CanSkate programs. This three-tiered recognition program acknowledges clubs and skating schools working to meet Skate Canada's delivery standard. CanSkate Excellence gives clubs and coaches the opportunity to share ideas with one another in the webinar portion of the program, and bridges communication gaps between newer and experienced coaches.

Number of clubs and skating schools currently involved in the CanSkate Excellence Program:

This brings us to a total of 195 Clubs that are involved in the CanSkate Excellence Program, up from 175 clubs in the 2022-2023 season!



CanSkate Excellence Program Incentives

This season 16 "Exceeded" clubs received tickets to the Stars on Ice Shows in various locations.

"Member of CanSkate Excellence" banners have been designed and will be ready to send out to Achieved and Exceeded clubs to display in their arena. These clubs will also receive a new Challenge Zone teaching aid designed to help clubs and coaches incorporate the challenge zone into their CanSkate program. This tool has 30 different challenge cards (5 for each of the 6 stages) that will hang in a pocket organizer at rink side.









Club and Skating School Visits


50 club and skating school visits were completed by the sport team this year.

This initiative is a great opportunity to make personal connections, collect valuable data and reassure our clubs and skating schools that we are here to help as we understand the unique challenges that they face.









The first year of the pilot program was met with overwhelming success in Sioux Lookout, adding consistency to the delivery of their on-ice and off-ice programming as well as substantial coach improvement.

Two coaches from the club took part in a coach mentorship piece of the program, where they both spent some time with National level coaches including Janice Morgan, Alison Purkiss and Nancy Lemaire at their home rinks.






Volunteer Week: High Five a Volunteer

National Volunteer Week took place this year from April 14-20, 2024 and Skate Ontario was thrilled to have the opportunity to celebrate those who give back selflessly to our sport. We truly could not operate and develop figure skating in Ontario without our incredible volunteers and want to thank each and every one of them for their contributions.

Volunteers deserve to be celebrated 365 days a year! That's why Skate Ontario launched the 'high five a volunteer' campaign in 2024. Each volunteer recognized for this campaign received a personalized email from Skate Ontario with why they were 'high fived' as well as a personalized, official certificate. Many were also featured on Skate Ontario's social media! During National Volunteer Week 2024, we were thrilled to 'High-Five' 78 volunteers, and feature 10 volunteers on our social media channels.

Athlete Development Seminars

To kick off the season from September-November, we offered Athlete Development Seminars to clubs and skating schools across the province, and provided athletes from the STAR 5-Gold levels and Regional level and higher coaches around the province in **4 locations**:

- Whitby
- Milton
- Ottawa
- Strathroy

Working in partnership with Flexafit and Vesna Markovitch, we offered 4 opportunities to learn about on-ice skating skills, edges and turns, as well as developing off-ice fitness and movement exercises that can be applied in the athlete's daily training environment.

Adult Development Seminars

Skate Ontario is committed to fostering the development and improving the experience of Adult skaters across the province.

Based on our findings and conversations from the Adult Symposium at the end of the 2022-2023 season, we ran two Adult Development Seminar opportunities this year. The first seminar took place near the beginning of the season in Ottawa, and the other at the end of the season in Mississauga.

Ottawa – Attended by 24 Athletes, 1 Coach Mississauga – Attended by 49 Athletes, 9 Coaches

Both seminars were open to all adult athletes from the STAR 1 level and higher and were also open for any coaches to attend. These seminars focused on-ice movement, off-ice strength and skills, and provided opportunities to chat with officials to gain a better understanding of rules, report cards, Program Components, and GOEs.




Bring ON the Fun!

51 provincial champions were crowned in various individual, pairs, ice dance and synchro categories.










Coaches

Skate Ontario is proud to have over 2,000 registered coaches to support the development of skaters at all levels and disciplines, from learn to skate up to skaters competing at the World Championships and Olympic Games.

Coach Development Seminar

A Coach Development Seminar held at the end of the season in Belleville with **47 coaches in attendance** from across Ontario.

The seminar's focus was to give coaches the opportunity to learn and ask questions from an ISU level official about the Interruption Rules and gain a better understanding of GOE's. Coaches also learned about program composition and choreography and gained knowledge on exercises to improve on-ice and off-ice jump technique.

Officials

Skate Ontario has **323 certified Officials**, including Singles, Pairs, Dance, STAR 1-4 and Synchronized Skating Judges, Technical Officials, Referees and Event Technicians.

Officials Training

This season, **Skate Ontario hosted 46 training** sessions for Officials. We are pleased to report that there were **544 registrants for these 46 sessions**, with many of our wonderful Officials attending several sessions.

Data Specialists

Introduction of the Officials Lounge

The Skate Ontario Officials Lounge launched last season. This is an online lounge providing Skate Ontario specific content, resources and information about educational opportunities, including; clinics, seminars and webinars to Ontario Officials.

Inside of the Officials Lounge, Officials' are able to;

- Register for clinics and webinars
- Watch recordings from the various education and development opportunities
- Read Skate Ontario communications
- Access links to Skate Canada and ISU resources


Skate Ontario's Lounge also has a mechanism for Officials to reach out and discuss (share ideas and ask questions) with colleagues from across the province through a discussion board.


