A key highlight of the year was hosting our inaugural Skate Ontario Coaches Conference. This milestone event welcomed nearly 90 coaches from across the province for a weekend of learning, connection, and community-building, an important investment in the future of coaching in Ontario.

We also celebrated incredible high-performance achievements. Most notably, Piper Gilles and Paul Poirier earned their second consecutive World silver medal in ice dance—an inspiring moment of pride for all of us. We also extend our congratulations to all the singles, pairs, dance, and synchronized skating athletes who proudly represented Ontario and Canada on national and international stages.

Our 2024–2025 event season was filled with energy and engagement, featuring 47 events with almost 20,000 entries. The season concluded with the Provincial Championships in March, where over 900 athletes took to the ice. These events would not be possible without the tireless dedication of our Local Organizing Committees, volunteers, and officials. We are incredibly grateful for your time, energy, and commitment.

# Club and Skating School Services

Skate Ontario proudly supported **331 active** member clubs and skating schools throughout the 2024/25 season. These outstanding organizations form the backbone of Ontario's vibrant skating community, inspiring excellence and fostering a love for the sport across the province.



Now three years in, the Skate Ontario
Organizational Excellence Program continues to
pick up speed and offer enhanced services and
support to our member clubs and skating schools.
This program provides education, resources,
support and accountability to our member clubs
and skating schools facilitating the implementation
of good governance, sound fiscal practices, risk
management and communication.

We are pleased to report that the results of this survey report an overall Member Satisfaction Rating of 8.3%.


#### **Additional Achievements:**

### **Club Visits**

This year, the Skate Ontario sport team conducted **visits to 25 clubs and skating schools across Ontario**. The primary goal was to engage with organizations that had not previously participated in Skate Ontario programs or opportunities, such as CanSkate Excellence and various sanctioned events.

These visits provided valuable insight into the barriers that have prevented some clubs/skating schools from getting involved. The feedback revealed a range of challenges, including financial constraints, difficulty in securing volunteers, and misconceptions about the purpose and structure of Skate Ontario programs.

Importantly, these in-person interactions have strengthened relationships between Skate Ontario and these clubs/skating schools. Many expressed that they now feel more confident and informed—and are more likely to reach out to a Skate Ontario staff member for support in the future. This initiative marks a positive step forward in building stronger connections and increasing participation across the province.



### CanSkate Excellence

CanSkate is Canada's flagship learn to skate program, emphasizing quality fundamental movements and basic skating skills. The Skate Ontario CanSkate Excellence Recognition Program rewards Ontario clubs and skating schools implementing best practices in the delivery of their CanSkate programs.

This tiered recognition program celebrates the efforts of clubs and skating schools striving to meet Skate Canada's delivery standards. Through CanSkate Excellence, coaches and clubs are encouraged to exchange ideas during dedicated webinars, fostering collaboration and helping to strengthen connections between new and seasoned coaches.

All Clubs and Skating Schools at the Achieved and Exceeded level of Recognition received their CanSkate Excellence Promotional Kit which included the Proud Member Banner and Challenge Zone Cards with pocket organizer as well as new Fundamental Station signs.

### **STAR 1-5 Excellence**

In September 2024, Skate Ontario launched the STAR 1-5 Excellence Recognition Program. This initiative is designed not only to recognize clubs and skating schools across Ontario, but also to support and educate coaches in aligning their programs with national delivery standards.

Over 200 coaches representing 145 clubs have attended Skate Ontario's STAR 1-5 Excellence webinars.

These sessions provide comprehensive information to help clubs and skating schools deliver successful programming that not only meets Skate Canada's delivery standards but also promotes athlete-centered development. Discussions focus on the Learn to Train stage of the Long-Term Development (LTD) framework and explore strategies to make learning figure skating engaging and enjoyable. Coaches have the opportunity to ask questions and share fun, creative ideas with one another during the webinar.


## **Athlete Development**

Over the course of the season, Skate Ontario offered various athlete development opportunities for skaters across the province, including:

- A monitoring session for synchro teams competing at the 2025 Skate Canada Cup:
  - Canada Cup Monitoring: 13 teams
- A pre-nationals competition simulation for junior and senior athletes competing at the 2025 Canadian Figure Skating Championships, which included ISU officials and officials development opportunities.
  - Pre-Nationals Competition Simulation, Junior and Senior: 32 of Ontario's 40 national entries participated in the simulation across the women's, men's, pair and ice dance disciplines
  - **Pre-Nationals Training Day, Pre-Novice and Novice:** 49 singles athletes, 7 pair teams, 11 dance teams

# Adult Development

This season, Skate Ontario proudly hosted an Adult Development Seminar at the end of March designed for adult athletes across the STAR 1 to Gold levels. Held in Kitchener-Waterloo, the seminar welcomed 34 athletes and focused on enhancing on-ice skating skills, off-ice jump techniques, and on-ice spins. Attendees had the unique opportunity to learn from an esteemed lineup of experts, including Olympic Silver Medalist Elizabeth Manley, National Level Coach Jessica Wyant, and Sylvie DeCaen, National Coach and Lead Harness Technician at The Rotation Room KW.

#### 2025 Skate Ontario Coaches Conference

At the beginning of May, Skate Ontario proudly hosted its inaugural Coaches Conference at the beautiful White Oaks Resort and Spa in Niagara-on-the-Lake welcoming 87 passionate coaches from across the province—from Sioux Lookout to Nepean to Windsor and many communities in between —creating a vibrant and collaborative learning environment.



The weekend began with a lively Networking Night, where coaches had the opportunity to connect with one another, as well as with expert facilitators and representatives from both Skate Ontario and Skate Canada. Over the next day and a half, participants took part in a dynamic mix of off-ice workshops and on-ice sessions led by world-class coaches, sport performance specialists, and ISU-level officials.

Designed to strengthen coaching excellence, the 2025 Coaches Conference emphasized athlete-centred development, with engaging sessions on mental performance, team dynamics, and overall well-being. Coaches also advanced their technical and tactical knowledge to better support skaters both on and off the ice.

The energy and enthusiasm throughout the weekend were a testament to the commitment and passion of Ontario's coaching community. Coaches left feeling inspired, recharged, and ready to bring new insights into the upcoming season.


