PURPOSE OF SECTIONALS

The Skate Ontario Sectional Championships identify the top skaters in Ontario for advancement to the next round of qualifying events ultimately leading to the Canadian National Skating Championships.

The 2027 Skate Canada – Skate Ontario Junior and Senior Sectional Championships will be conducted in accordance with Skate Canada Competition Rules.

ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE

Entrants in Canadian Championship events or qualifying events for Canadian Championships shall:

- (1) Eligible Person Status: Be eligible as defined in the Skate Canada Rule Book
- (2) Associate Member: Be Associate Member in good standing of the association
- (3) Canadian Citizenships: Be Canadian citizens within the meaning of the Citizenship Act, RSC 1985. If the individual is not a Canadian citizen, such individual must have permanent resident status and have resided in Canada for at least one year prior to the date of the Championships they wish to enter. Also, if the entrant is of legal age, the entrant must file a declaration to indicate that he intends in good faith to become a Canadian citizen. If the entrant is an alien minor, he and the living parents (or guardians if both parents are deceased) must have also filed a sworn statement with the Chief Executive Officer of Skate Canada that said minor intends to become a citizen as soon as legally possible.

In the case of a pair or an ice dance couple, at least one partner must be a Canadian citizen. The other partner may be a citizen or resident of a country of any other ISU Member and need not reside in Canada.

All Non-Canadian citizens interested in competing in the 2026-2027 Skate Canada Qualifying Competitions are required to complete the [NON-CANADIAN CITIZEN APPLICATION](#) and present their “Acceptance Letter” from Skate Canada during entry registration for the 2026-2027 Qualifying Competition. Deadline to complete the Non-Canadian Citizen Application is September 7, 2026.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR ENTRY (SKATE CANADA RULES OF SPORT)

- (1) **ASSESSMENT REQUIREMENTS FOR THE 2026-2027 SEASON:** Competitors wishing to enter Qualifying Events leading to Skate Canada Challenge and/or the Canadian Figure Skating Championships must have passed the assessments as outlined in the competition program requirements for each discipline at least three weeks prior to the Section Championships preceding those competitions.

- (2) **AGE PREREQUISITES:** Competitors wishing to enter Qualifying Events leading to Skate Canada Challenge and/or Canadian Figure Skating Championship must meet the age requirements to compete as specified in the competition program requirements for each discipline.
- (3) **COMPETING IN SINGLES AT SECTIONALS:** A skater may compete in Singles events only in the championships of the section in which that competitor's home organization is a member.
- (4) **COMPETING IN PAIR OR DANCE AT SECTIONALS:** A pairs or dance team composed of competitors having home clubs/skating schools in different Sections may enter the event of the Sectional Championships of any one, but only one, of the Sections represented by its members. The Chair of each Section concerned must be advised as to which championship the team will enter.

SKATE ONTARIO QUALIFYING STRUCTURE SECTIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS – 2026/2027 SEASON

[Event Series Information - Skate Ontario](#)

For the 2026/2027 season, the following qualifying system will be used for entry into the 2027 Skate Ontario Sectional Championships. This qualifying system applies for skaters who are competing in Pre-Novice, Novice, Junior and Senior, in the Men, Women, Pair and Ice Dance categories.

Athletes will qualify for both the 2027 Skate Ontario Sectional Championships using the following criteria:

1. **Qualifying Declaration:** All athletes who compete in Pre-Novice through Senior category at any 2026-2027 Skate Ontario Sectional Series event will automatically have their scores tracked and ranked for qualifying purposes. There is NO declaration to complete this season.
1. **Qualifying Scores:** For Junior and Senior categories, scores from the August, September and October Skate Ontario Sectional Series events will be used for the 2026/2027 qualifying process.

For Pre-Novice and Novice categories, scores from the September, October and November Skate Ontario Sectional Series events will be used for the 2026/2027 qualifying process.

The highest overall score at the Sectional Series events listed above from each athlete and/or team, will be used to create the final ranking order for qualification in each category and discipline to both the 2027 Skate Ontario Sectional Championships.

- The overall score is the combined total score of the Short Program/Rhythm Dance/Pattern Dance and the Free Program from the same event.

If a category does not exceed the maximum number of entries, there will be no required score needed to compete at either of the 2027 Skate Ontario Sectional Championships

Only 2026-2027 Skate Ontario Sectional Series event scores may be used as part of the 2026/2027 Skate Ontario Sectional qualifying process. The only exception to this is when an athlete and/or team is assigned to a travel team by Skate Canada. In this situation only, the score from the selected event may be used as their Sectional qualifying score.

Please note that there is no minimum score requirement for either of the 2027 Skate Ontario Sectional Championships. In the absence of a Minimum Technical score, Skate Ontario reserves the right to ensure athletes assigned to both the Skate Ontario Challenge teams are at an appropriate competitive level for those events.

A minimum technical score [outlined by Skate Canada](#) is still required for the 2026/2027 Skate Canada Challenge, the 2026-2027 Skate Canada Trophy, and the 2027 Canadian National Skating Championships.

Maximum Entries per Category for the 2027 Skate Ontario Junior and Senior Sectional Championships

The maximum number of entries per category will be as follows:

SENIOR

Women Singles: Maximum of 36 entries
Men Singles: Maximum of 36 entries
Pair: Maximum of 24 teams
Partnered Ice Dance: Maximum of 30 teams
Solo Ice Dance: Maximum of 26 entries

JUNIOR

Women Singles: Maximum of 36 entries
Men Singles: Maximum of 36 entries
Pair: Maximum of 24 teams
Partnered Ice Dance: Maximum of 30 teams
Solo Ice Dance: Maximum of 36 entries

Extraordinary circumstance considerations related to the 2026-2027 Sectional Qualifying structure may be granted by the High Performance Manager in consultation with the Skate Ontario Executive Director. Considerations will only be granted in extraordinary circumstances where the skater has demonstrated worthiness for such consideration. Such an exception will generally be related to medical conditions. Requests for an exception should be made in writing to the Skate Ontario High Performance Manager by October 19, 2026, and must contain a description of the grounds upon which it is being requested

CHALLENGE MINIMUM TECHNICAL SCORES

A [minimum technical score outlined by Skate Canada](#) is required for the 2026-2027 Skate Canada Challenge, 2026-2027 Skate Canada Trophy and the 2027 Canadian National Skating Championships.

Registration for **Pre-Novice & Novice Singles, Pair, and Ice Dance**, as well as **Junior and Senior Solo Dance** will open **Tuesday, September 1, 2026, at 10:00 AM ET**. Registration will close Monday, September 7 at 11:59 PM ET.

Registration for **Junior & Senior Synchro** will open **Tuesday, September 1, at 1:00 PM ET**. Registration will close Monday, September 7 at 11:59 PM ET. *Team rosters must be completed by Monday, September 28.*

Access to online registration will cease at 11:59 PM ET Monday, September 7, 2026.

Junior and Senior athletes who qualify for the 2027 Skate Ontario Junior & Senior Sectional Championships will be emailed a registration link from Chris Mabee, cmabee@skateontario.org. Registration links will be emailed on Monday, October 19, 2026.

CATEGORIES

Starting Orders shall be determined by a random draw for the first segment. For categories with 2 segments, competitors will be assigned to skate the second segment in reverse order of the results from the first segment.

Please refer to Skate Canada Rule Book and/or ISU website for the applicable program requirements and program lengths for each event for the 2026/2027 season.

Senior	Must have passed the complete Gold Freeskate Assessment No age requirement

PAIR

Pre-Novice	Must have passed the complete STAR 6 (or equivalent) Freeskate Assessment or higher Must not have reached the age of 18 before July 1, 2026
Novice	Must have passed the complete STAR 10 (or equivalent) Freeskate Assessment or higher No age requirement
Junior	Must have passed the complete Gold Freeskate Assessment No age requirement
Senior	Must have passed the complete Gold Freeskate Assessment No age requirement

PARTNERED ICE DANCE

Pre-Novice	At least one partner must have passed the complete STAR 5 (or equivalent) Dance Assessment or higher Must not have reached the age of 18 before July 1, 2026 Pattern Dances to be skated: 1. Rocker Foxtrot (4 sequences) 2. Starlight Waltz (2 sequences)
Novice	At least one partner must have passed the complete STAR 8 (or equivalent) Dance Assessment or higher Must not have reached the age of 21 before July 1, 2026 Pattern Dances to be skated: 1. Starlight Waltz (2 sequences) 2. Quickstep (4 sequences)

Junior	At least one partner must have passed Gold A and Gold B Dance Assessments or higher Must not have reached the age of 21 before July 1, 2026
Senior	At least one partner must have passed Gold A and Gold B Dance Assessments or higher No age requirement

SOLO ICE DANCE

Pre-Novice	Must have passed the complete STAR 5 (or equivalent) Dance Assessment or higher Must not have reached the age of 18 before July 1, 2026 Pattern Dances to be skated: 1. Rocker Foxtrot (4 sequences) 2. Starlight Waltz (2 sequences)
Novice	Must have passed the complete STAR 8 (or equivalent) Dance Assessment or higher Must not have reached the age of 21 before July 1, 2026 Pattern Dances to be skated: 1. Starlight Waltz (2 sequences) 2. Quickstep (4 sequences)
Junior	Must have passed Gold A and Gold B Dance Assessments or higher Must not have reached the age of 21 before July 1, 2026
Senior	Must have passed Gold A and Gold B Dance Assessments or higher No age requirement

SYNCHRO

Junior	Teams consist of 12 to 16 skaters Must meet ISU Junior age criteria (skaters must have reached the age of 13 but must not have reached the age of 19 before July 1, 2026)
Senior	Teams consist of 12 to 16 skaters. Skaters must have reached at least the age of 17 as of July 1, 2026

MUSIC & PPC REQUIREMENTS

Both music and PPCs will be collected through SkateReg. You may complete the music & PPC fields at the time of registration, OR you can leave these fields blank, complete your registration, then log back into your account at a later date to submit your music and/or PPCs before the deadline. Please note, the late fee for late music & PPCs submissions has been increased to **\$75.00** for the 2026-2027 season.

BACK-UP MUSIC - USB:

Skaters are asked to bring a MP3 version back-up of their music on a USB stick to the event, to be kept ice level with their coach. For skaters competing in more than 1 category, it is HIGHLY recommended that a separate back-up USB drive be available for each piece of music.

Alternate electronic items such as cellphones, tablets, mp3 players etc. will not be accepted.

CONFIRMATION EMAILS

A summary of the registration will be automatically generated and sent to the email address on the registrant's profile. Registration receipts can be found on your SkateReg account.

Coaches will not receive an email confirmation of their skater's registration. Skaters should confirm with their coaches that they have registered.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Registration is finalized only when all information is filled in and payment completed. Your receipt of payment is your registration confirmation. Please print your receipt and retain for your records.

AGE REQUIREMENTS: As of July 1, 2026.

MAXIMUM AGE REQUIREMENTS: All STAR categories have a maximum age limit of 21 as of July 1, 2026.

AGE CATEGORIES: For any skater competing in a category that is divided by age, skaters are required to compete in the appropriate age bracket. Example: If a skater is competing in Pre-Juvenile and is 10 years old as of July 1 of that year, they are not eligible to compete in Pre-Juvenile U13.

TEST REQUIREMENTS: As of February 15, 2027.

REGISTERED IN MULTIPLE CATEGORIES: Skaters choosing to enter multiple categories, do so with the understanding that there may be scheduling conflicts that allow for minimum preparation time between categories.

STARTING ORDERS: Starting Orders shall be determined by a random draw for the first segment. For categories with 2 segments, competitors will be assigned to skate the second segment in reverse order of the results from the first segment.

START ORDERS/RESULTS/DETAIL SHEETS: The start order/results and detail sheets will be posted on the [Skate Ontario website](#). Results and detail sheets will NOT be provided on-site at the competition.

LATE ENTRIES: Entries received after the closing date will be considered by the Technical Representative for registration. Late entries are subject to a late fee of a \$50.00. No late entries will be considered after start orders are posted (two weeks before event start). All late fees are 100% non-refundable.

SINGLE ENTRIES: Skate Ontario reserves the right to cancel any categories with only 1 registrant. If an event has only one registrant, they will be contacted about next steps after registration closes.

CANCELLED CATEGORIES: Skate Ontario reserves the right to cancel any categories based on registration needs.

REFUNDS: Full refunds will be given for any cancelled categories. NO REFUNDS (including medical) will be given after registration closes.

WITHDRAWALS PRIOR TO REGISTRATION CLOSE: If an entry is withdrawn prior to the registration closing date, a refund (less an administrative fee of \$50.00 per skater/team) will be granted.

CHANGE OF CATEGORY FEE: There will be a \$50.00 change of category fee applied for each granted change request after an online registration has been submitted.

LATE MUSIC SUBMISSION: There will be a **\$75.00** late fee applied for failing to register Music by the deadline listed in the announcement. Skaters will not be permitted to register at the competition until this fee has been paid and their music has been submitted.

PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT (PPC): There will be a **\$75.00** late fee applied for failing to submit PPCs by the deadline listed in the announcement. Skaters will not be permitted to register at the competition until this fee has been paid and their PPCs have been submitted.

RESTRICTIONS:

- In the case of a very large entry in any category, the entries will be drawn into groups which will be determined by random draw. All groups are final and cannot be changed.
- Single skaters are permitted to enter only one singles freeskate category. For example: registering for STAR 6 Freeskate and Juvenile Freeskate are not permitted. Skaters may register for one freeskate category and one short program category. Skaters may register for two different disciplines such as a singles category and a dance category.

WITHDRAW PROCEDURE: Skaters needing to withdraw from the event, should email the Skate Ontario Event Staff Point of Contact (SOSPOC). Written notice should come directly from the skater, parent/guardian, or either of the listed attending coaches.

WAIVERS: All waivers must be signed and completed through SkateReg, Skate Ontario's event registration system, prior to on-site registration.

ON-SITE REGISTRATION: All competitors and Skate Canada registered coaches are required to register upon arrival at the arena. Specific on-site registration instructions will be shared prior to the competition.

COACH ACCREDITATION: To be accredited at the 2027 Skate Ontario Junior and Senior Sectional Championships, coaches must meet the following conditions:

- Meet the NCCP Requirements for the level of athlete attending with
- Be a current Professional Coaching Member of Skate Canada in good standing

Ontario coaches must present their Skate Ontario issued Coach's Accreditation Tag. No other form of identification will be accepted. Out of province coaches must provide proof at that they are a Registered Skate Canada Professional Coach in Good Standing when registering at the Coaches' sign in table. These coaches may be asked to show their Skate Canada dashboard.

Additional Considerations:

- Skate Canada Coaches in good standing who are in the process of achieving an NCCP certification may obtain a one-time exemption during one skating season. Those with a NCCP in-training or trained status may obtain temporary accreditation privileges provided the NCCP status of the coach aligns with the Competition Category and the Skate Canada event. An exemption request must be submitted to the Section for consideration.
- To obtain accreditation privileges, non-resident coaches who are not registered Skate Canada coaches in good standing, must submit proof of a valid screening from their home country prior to traveling to a Skate Canada domestic event.

AWARDS: Medals for first, second and third place will be awarded for each category. Medal presentation information will be available at the competition.

PROTESTS: For events using the Cumulative Points Calculation (CPC) scoring system, protests must be made as per the [Skate Canada Protest Procedure](#). Decisions of the officials categorized as field of play may not be protested, except as noted in the Protest Procedure. Items that can be protested: Participation of a competitor in the competition, Composition of panels of officials, Determination of the results of a competition

All protests regarding the determination of the result for a competitor(s) in the competition must be filed immediately after, but within no more than one hour, of the posting of the full and detailed results for the Segment in question. All protests must be in writing.
